The salary scale is in accordance with the current national rate and placement within the scale will be in accordance with previous reckonable service.
Salary is paid monthly by credit transfer into your bank account on the 28 th of each month, or the preceding Friday if the 28 th should fall on a weekend.
Foundation Trainees are entitled to 27 days annual leave in
the year.
The 27 days entitlement does not include the 8 statutory holidays. If a foundation doctor works any part of a bank holiday they are entitled to an additional days leave in lieu. In some specialties there is some restriction on when a foundation doctor can take their leave during the 4 months (e.g. not on their 'hot week' for surgery). The individual directorates will inform the foundation doctor of any specific restrictions on when they can take leave.
The Trust will consider British /EEA nationals for
appointment in the first instance. If the applicant is a non-
resident of the United Kingdom or European Economic
Union, they are required to have a valid work visa and leave
to remain in the UK, which is renewed as required. The
Trust is unable to employ or continue to employ the
applicant/post holder if they require but do not have a valid
work visa and/or leave to remain in the UK. Downsview House is a newly built residences block on the Great Western Hospital site built and managed by UNITE. There are 143 units comprising of 4/5 Room cluster Flats and Studios for single occupancy and 1 Bed Flats for couples (no children or pets allowed). A number of these rooms are fully adapted for wheelchair use. Each room is en-suite and fully furnished with a single bed, wardrobe, drawers, desk, bookcase, desk and easy chair, lamp, radio alarm clock, mini kettle and mugs, pin board, waste bin and telephone. The room is also provided with bedding and towels that will be changed regularly. There is a cleaning service to the rooms; however, you are expected to keep your room in a clean and tidy condition. Each cluster flat has a communal area for cooking, dining and socialising. These are fully furnished and equipped with kitchen units, cooker, hob, fridge-freezer, dishwasher, coffee maker, TV, Video, iron & ironing board, vacuum cleaner, mop & bucket, dining table & chairs, easy chairs and coffee table and all kitchen utensils, crockery, cutlery and saucepans. The one bedroomed flats comprise a large kitchen/lounge/dining room, a double room, a shower room/pod and a cleaning/storage cupboard. These flats contain all the same elements that are in each of the ensuite rooms and cluster flats communal areas. Current rates: £333.60 per month (£77.00 per week) inclusive of bills.
